The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Moultonborough Fire Rescue Department: For the period of 06/27/2022-07/03/2022, there were thirty-five calls for service: There was: 27 - EMS incidents, 1 - Vehicle accident with injuries, 1 - Motor vehicle accidents without injuries, 1 - Authorized, controlled burning, 1 - No incident found upon arrival at dispatched location, 2 - Alarm system activation due to malfunction, 2 - Alarm systems activation, no fire, unintentional. **Total 2022 Incidents: 467 Automatic Aid:** received twelve times from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** none **Overlapping Incidents:** 3 **Year to Date:** 80 **Percentage of Call Volume:** 17.1% - Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 6/29 - Chief Bengtson attended the Dept. Head staff meeting and MTS training session. 6/30 - Chief Bengtson attended the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Executive Committee meeting at the Communication Center in Laconia. Chief Bengtson participated in a Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Board of Directors special meeting called to allow for the presentation of a computer aided dispatching (CAD) system being recommended by the staff and the Executive Committee. The Board of Directors received a presentation from Chief Coordinator Goldman on Tyler CAD, a cloud-based system. The Directors voted to purchase the Tyler CAD system for \$562,316 with a cost sharing agreement with the Capital Area Mutual Aid Compact. Lakes Region's share will be \$292,365. Using the same system for both dispatching centers allows for redundancy and back-ups in the event either communications center is damaged. The Tyler CAD

system can also be used for remote dispatching in the field. The new CAD should go operational in August of 2023.

COVID-19 Status Report: The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services COVID-19 Dashboards located at <https://www.nh.gov/covid19> indicate that as of 07/01/2022, Moultonborough currently is shown as having 11 new cases in the last 14-days and has had a cumulative total of 734 cases. 17.6 % of the Town's population has contracted COVID-19 virus. 69.3% of the Town's population has been fully vaccinated.

Burning Permits: Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

Fireworks: Residents, property owners and guests are reminded of the following regarding fireworks requirements:

- 1) Anyone interested in purchasing, possessing, or using Permissible Fireworks must be at least 21 years of age.
- 2) Shall only be used on private property which you own, or have written permission from the landowner, or be in the owner's presence.
- 3) Must follow ALL locally adopted local ordinances.
 - a. Moultonborough's Ordinance #22 limits the use of consumer fireworks to the hours between 12 noon and 10:00 pm. Exceptions are two holidays, as recognized by the Town: (1) the 4th of July: limit use to 12 noon to 12 midnight; (2) New Year, limit use to 12 noon and up to 15 minutes past midnight of the holiday.
- 4) You can be held liable in any civil action for damages to another's property.
