The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Town Administrator: The week before last I was able to attend the “Lakes Region Planning Commission (LRPC) 2022 Annual Meeting and 55th Anniversary Kick-Off Celebration.” At the event, on behalf of the town, I received their award for “Household Hazardous Waste” host site. The Town of Moultonborough was recognized by LRPC for our continued dedication and efforts to the program. Each year, usually the first Saturday in August at the Highway Garage, Department of Public Works, Facilities & Grounds, along with many volunteers, will host this one-day event in which household hazardous materials such as antifreeze, fluorescent light bulbs, and chemicals, not deposited at the Transfer Station, can be disposed.
