Department of Public Works

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste=36 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycle=15 tons, 5 containers of construction and demolition=25 tons, 1 container of mixed scrap metal and 1 container of electronic waste. Brush pile was burned, and compost pile turned. Car counts: Monday 499, Tuesday 560, Friday 725, Saturday 397, Sunday 300 total 2481 residents served.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 283 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 10 Assist Citizens, 10 Motor Vehicle Stops, 17 Assists to Fire/EMS, 5 Directed Patrols, 2 Arrest, 9 complaints, 1 MV Accidents, 5 MV Complaints, 8 Residential Alarms, 2 Commercial Alarms, and 4 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire Department: For the period of 07/18/2022-07/24/2022, there were forty-nine calls for service: There was: 19 – EMS incidents, 1 – LP gas leak, 12 – Power lines down, 1 – Arcing, shorted electrical equipment, 3 – Building/structure weakened, 2 – Assist other government agency, 1 – Water leak, 1 – Public service, 1 – Assist the physically disabled, 1 – Dispatched & cancelled en-route, 1 – No incident found upon arrival, 2 – Smoke detector activation due to malfunction, 2 – Alarm system activation due to malfunction, 1 – Smoke detector activation, no fire, unintentional, 1 – Alarm system activation, no fire, unintentional. **Total 2022 Incidents: 585.** **Automatic Aid:** received three times from Center Harbor, twice from Tuftonboro, once from twice from Gilford, once from Meredith and three times from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** none. **Overlapping Incidents:** 22. **Year to Date:** 120. **Percentage of Call Volume:** 20.5%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 7/21 Thunderstorms that moved through the Town in the afternoon and early evening again created considerable activity for the fire and police departments. The fire department responded to twenty-one incidents on Thursday in a five-hour span. The most significant incident was at Camp Robindel, where downed trees caused a LP gas leak. Between downed power lines and the uncontrolled gas leak, the camp was evacuated to Moultonborough Academy. The fire chief notified the Select Board and requested a Town-wide State of Emergency declaration. The Select Board voted to approve the State of Emergency declaration. The State of Emergency remained in effect until 10:30 Friday, July 22, 2022. At the height of the State of Emergency, the NHEC indicated approximately 4,000 of its 6,000 customers in town were without power. All customers were shown as having power by late Saturday.

CodeRed: Multiple CodeRed Weather Warning were issued on Thursday. Residents and guest can subscribe to receive community notifications and weather alerts by clicking on the CodeRed icon on the Town's website.

COVID-19 Status Report: The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services COVID-19 Dashboards located at <https://www.nh.gov/covid19> indicate that as of 07/21/2022, Moultonborough currently is shown as having 14 new cases in the last 14-days and has had a cumulative total of 749 cases. 18 % of the Town's population has contracted COVID-19 virus. 69.4% of the Town's population has been fully vaccinated.

New Hampshire currently has fully vaccinated 63.3 % of the population. 71 % of NH residents have received the first dose.

Burning Permits: Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that “written permission” must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

Fireworks: Residents, property owners and guests are reminded of the following regarding fireworks:

Requirements:

- 1) Anyone interested in purchasing, possessing, or using Permissible Fireworks must be at least 21 years of age.
- 2) Shall only be used on private property which you own, or have written permission from the landowner, or be in the owner's presence.
- 3) Must follow ALL locally adopted local ordinances.
 - Moultonborough's Ordinance #22 limits the use of consumer fireworks to the hours between 12 noon and 10:00 pm. Exceptions are two holidays, as recognized by the Town: (1) the 4th of July: limit use to 12 noon to 12 midnight; (2) New Year, limit use to 12 noon and up to 15 minutes past midnight of the holiday.
- 4) You can be held liable in any civil action for damages to another's property.
