The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Transfer Station: This week we shipped 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of singles stream recycle = 10 tons and 6 containers of construction and demolition = 30 tons. Electronic waste, tires and scrap metal was shipped. Brush pile was burned, and compost pile turned.

Car counts Monday 302, Tuesday 432, Friday 438, Saturday 347 Sunday 268 total 1787 residents served.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 192 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 8 Assist Citizen, 3 Motor Vehicle Stops, 19 Assists to Fire/EMS, 0 Directed Patrols, 3 Arrest, 0 complaints, 3 MV Accidents, 1 MV Complaints, 5 Residential Alarms, 3 Commercial Alarms, and 1 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire Department: For the period of 09/19/2022 to 09/25/2022, there were twenty-nine calls for service: There was: 1 Transport vehicle fire, 2 Excessive heat, scorch burns with no ignition, 14 EMS incidents, 1 Arcing, shorted electrical equipment, 1 Assist the police/government agency, 1 Assist the physically disabled, 3 Public assistance, 1 Cover assignment, 1 Dispatched & canceled en-route, 2 No incident found upon arrival at dispatched address, 1 Smoke detector activation due to malfunction, 1 Alarm system activation, no fire, unintentional. **Total 2022 Incidents: 789. Automatic Aid:** received six times from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** received twice from Center Harbor. **Overlapping Incidents: 6 Year to Date: 145 Percentage of Call Volume: 18%.** Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 9/19 - The fire department responded to a vehicle fire on Redding Lane near the intersection of Whittier Highway. Upon arrival firefighter found a low equipment trailer on fire with an excavator onboard. The operator quickly removed the excavator, and the firefighter extinguished a fire underneath the trailer. The fire was caused by a flat tire and the trailer rubbing on the wheel. The fire department used Class A foam to extinguish the fire. Class A foam contains no PFOA's.

9/24 - Moultonborough firefighters along with assistance from Center Harbor Fire Rescue responded to the Red Hill Fire Tower Trail for an injured hiker. Crews used UTV's to respond most of the way in and hiked in the remaining distance. The patient was treated, then packaged and loaded into a rescue litter and transported back to the UTV, then transported to the parking lot and transferred to a waiting ambulance. The incident took a little over two hours, using ten firefighters from both communities.

9/25 - Center Harbor firefighter was requested to assist with investigating smoke in the building at a Captain's Walk residence. No hazard was found, and command was terminated. While returning from this incident, Moultonborough was dispatched to a stove fire on Abnaki Lane. Upon arrival the fire was out and only minor damage to an appliance was sustained.

The Town will need to update its Hazard Mitigation Plan. The Emergency Management Director has contacted the Lakes Region Planning Commission to assist with the update. LRPCC has worked with the Town to update its Hazard Mitigation Plan on several recent editions. A Hazard Mitigation Plan is a FEMA requirement and The NH Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security (HSEM) has been informed that FEMA - Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) FFY 2021 funding has been allocated to fund updating community Hazard Mitigation Plans.

CodeRed: With recent storms and hurricanes and winter pending, residents are advised to subscribe to receive community notifications and weather alerts by clicking on the CodeRed icon on the Town's website.

Burning Permits: Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.
