Department of Public Works

Moultonborough Fire Department: For the period of 01/16/2023 to 01/22/2023, there were sixteen calls for service: There was: 1 Building fire*, 11 EMS incidents, 3 Public Service, 1 Assist the physically disabled. **Total YTD 2023 Incidents: 56.** **Automatic Aid:** Received six times from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** Given once to Wolfeboro for a fourth alarm building fire. **Overlapping Incidents: 4** **Year to Date: 10** **Percentage of Call Volume:** 18% Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 1/16 - Moultonborough firefighters responded on a second alarm to Wolfeboro for a building fire at Hunter's Shop and Save. Engine 4 responded first and provided water supply to one of five aerial apparatus in use. Rescue 1 responded on a subsequent alarm to provided air for refilling SCBA cylinders. Moultonborough were released after six and half hours of work.

1/18 - The Day Shift installed Supra Boxes on Summit View Drive and Cardinal Street. Chief Bengtson attended a meeting at Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid communication center in Laconia as part of a committee reviewing the community assessment formula.

1/19 - The Chief , Chief Driscoll from Center Harbor and Chief Call from Sandwich met with the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Chief Coordinator Jon Goldman, Acting Deputy Coordinator Hanafin and Lt. Parker to discuss revisions to the Center Harbor, Sandwich and Moultonborough Run Cards to implement automatic aid responses for specific high risk incident types to include building fires, smoke in the building, vehicle, brush, dumpster fires with exposures, motor vehicle crashes with confirmed entrapment, and ice/water rescues. These incidents will trigger an automatic response from all three-fire department simultaneously. The self-contained breathing apparatus air compressor was serviced, and air samples taken by D.L. Thurrott. Annual preventive maintenance is required to ensure that the air being breathed by firefighters while wearing SCBA meets "Class D" standards.

1/20 - Chief Bengtson met with the Town Administrator to discuss Select Board feedback on the Fire Department budget proposal to add six new firefighter positions.

Burning Permits: Property owners are not required to obtain fire permits when the ground is covered by snow. RSA 125-N:4 prohibits the residential open burning of combustible domestic waste. " Combustible domestic waste " means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste. The term does not include untreated wood, leaves, brush, or paper products generated at a residence.

New Category 1 & 2 fire permits are required for 2023. Fire Permits for 2023 may be obtained at the Public Safety Building from 8a.m. to 5p.m. Monday through Friday or online at <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>
