The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration

Town Administrator: Prior to the end of last year my municipal management organization (MMANH) appointed me as our New Hampshire representative with ICMA's 2023 Annual Conference Educational Planning Committee. This past weekend I had the opportunity to travel to Austin, Texas, the location of this year's conference, and join fellow municipal managers from across the country and internationally, where we completed our recommendations for conference educational sessions. In total I reviewed over 300+ presentations from various presenters who submitted to ICMA for inclusion with our conference. Topics ranged from communication, finance/budgeting, career development, HR management, infrastructure, and technology. As we progress through the year, I will continue to work with the committee and presenters for their educational presentations at the conference.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 1 container of municipal solid waste = 12 tons, 1 container of single stream recycle = 5 tons, 2 containers of construction and demolition = 24 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal.

Attendants Bruce Purinton and Jim Nave fabricated a guard for the front-end loader to protect a vulnerable sensitive component with materials that were recycled at the facility at no cost to the town.

Moultonborough Fire Department: For the period of 01/30/2023 to 02/05/2023, there were twenty-three calls for service: There was: 11 EMS incidents, 2 Water leaks, 1 Assist the Police or other government agency, 1 Police matter, 1 Dispatched & cancelled en-route, 1 No incident found upon arrival at dispatched address, 1 Hazardous materials investigation with no Haz-Mat found, 2 Smoke detector activation due to malfunction, 2 Alarm system activation due to malfunction, 1 Alarm system activation, no fire, unintentional. **Total YTD 2023 Incidents: 99.** **Automatic Aid:** received four times from Center Harbor and five times from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** none. **Overlapping Incidents:** 4 **Year to Date:** 21. **Percentage of Call Volume:** 21%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: **2/1** - Chief Bengtson participated again in an online TEAMs meeting with a committee of fellow Directors of the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid communications center to assess modifications to the community assessment formula. The Committee will survey other communications centers serving similar fire dispatching center in the state, in the region and in the country. The committee is tasked with making a recommendation to the LRMFA Board of Directors on whether the current formula is equitable to all member communities or if it needs to be modified.

2/2 - Chief Bengtson participated in a TEAM's conference call with NH Homeland Security & Emergency Management for the severe cold weather forecasted to impact the State on 2/4 and 2/5.

2/4 - Firefighters responded to Moultonborough Academy for a fire alarm activation with fire pump activation. It was discovered that a leak in piping caused a drop in pressure triggering activation of the fire pump and fire alarm system. The custodial staff was on site, no damage

occurred. Activities scheduled in the building for the day were cancelled and Fire Watch plans were implemented until the problem can be fixed. Firefighters joined the custodial staff in checking the Central School as a precaution due to the extreme cold, no problems were found.

2/5 - Moultonborough and Center Harbor firefighters responded to two incidents on Whittier Highway and High Haith Road for water leaks due to frozen, burst pipes.

Burning Permits: Property owners are not required to obtain fire permits when the ground is covered by snow. RSA 125-N:4 prohibits the residential open burning of combustible domestic waste. " Combustible domestic waste " means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste. The term does not include untreated wood, leaves, brush, or paper products generated at a residence.

New Category 1 & 2 fire permits are required for 2023. Fire Permits for 2023 may be obtained at the Public Safety Building from 8a.m. to 5p.m. Monday through Friday or online at <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>
