Moultonborough Fire Department: For the period of 03/13/2023 to 03/19/2023, there were eighteen calls for service: There was: 10 EMS incidents, four* of the twelve incidents, no Fire Dept. response, Stewart's Ambulance only, 1 Motor vehicle accident with no injuries, 1 Furnace problem, delayed ignition causing smoke condition, 1 No incident found upon arrival at dispatched address, 4 *Dispatched, No Fire Department Response – EMS**, 2 Smoke detector activation due to malfunction, 3 Smoke detector activation, no fire, unintentional. **Total YTD 2023 Incidents: 206.** **Percent of increased from 2022: 26%. Automatic Aid:** four times from Stewart's Ambulance and once from Sandwich and twice from Center Harbor. **Mutual Aid:** none. **Overlapping Incidents: 2. Year to Date: 30. Percentage of Call Volume: 14.5%.** Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 3/16 - EMS Continuing education. 3/17 - The Department took delivery of new rescue struts; the Day Shift will mount them soon on Rescue 1.

Burning Permits: Burning permits for brush may be required for some areas of town dependent upon snow cover.

Property owners are not required to obtain fire permits when the ground is covered by snow. RSA 125-N:4 prohibits the residential open burning of combustible domestic waste. " Combustible domestic waste " means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste. The term does not include untreated wood, leaves, brush, or paper products generated at a residence.

New Category 1 & 2 fire permits are required for 2023. Fire Permits for 2023 may be obtained at the Public Safety Building from 8a.m. to 5p.m. Monday through Friday or online at <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>

Registrations are open for some exciting adult fitness opportunities at Moultonborough Recreation. Tai Chi with Board Certified Instructor Ernie Graffam will be offered on Tuesday and Thursday evenings, 6-7pm @ MRD beginning April 4. This 8-week program will focus on arthritis and fall prevention. Tai Chi is a series of gentle exercises & stretches, sometimes described as "meditation in motion" because it promotes serenity through gentle movements, connecting mind & body.
