The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste = 36 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycling = 15 tons and 9 containers of construction and demolition = 60 tons. Compost pile was turned, brush pile was burned, brush deposit area was repaired by highway dept., facility paved.

Operations

- 4/10 Chief Bengtson performed a Daycare inspection at 1026 Whittier Highway. The Department received factory/dealer training from Fire Tech and Safety of New England on the new battery-powered vehicle extrication tools. Firefighters were able to use the new tools on vehicles donated by Rickers Auto Salvage to force doors open, roll dashboards and cut off roofs. The new tools were purchased using funds from an anonymous donor, with no cost to the taxpayers. This purchase removes items from the Fire Department Capital Plan. The Department thanks Rickers Auto Salvage for their donation of vehicles.
- 4/11 The fire chief conducted a rough-in inspection of a residential, 13D fire sprinkler system installation on Jeremiah Smith Road. Administrative Assistant Shea attended virtual training on the Town’s new web site.

- 4/12 Administrative Assistant Shea and Chief Bengtson attended virtual training on the Town's new web site.
- 4/13 Lt. Frangelli, firefighters Brown and Houghton and Chief Bengtson attended virtual Forest Fire Warden/Deputy Warden training on fire permit laws and regulations. Training is required every three years by RES 5601. The fire chief conducted a rough-in inspection of a residential, 13D fire sprinkler system installation on Maple Lane.
- 4/15 The fire boat was put into service for the season. The boat is kept at the Town Dock's at Lee's Mills.

Burning Permits: Effective April 1, 2023, Fire permits are required for open burning, including campfires, and burning brush. Fire Permits may be obtained at the Public Safety Building located at 1035 Whittier Highway or online at www.NHFirePermit.com. Or <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>

The Daily Fire Danger forecast can be obtained by calling the Division of Forests and Lands wildfire information line (toll free): 1-866-NH-FIRES (866-643-4737). The Daily Fire Danger is also posted on the Smokey Bear sign outside the Public Safety Building.

RSA 125-N:4 prohibits the residential open burning of combustible domestic waste. " Combustible domestic waste " means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste. The term does not include untreated wood, leaves, brush, or paper products generated at a residence.
