The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste (24 tons), 2 containers of single stream recycling (10 tons), 6 containers of construction and demolition (30 tons) and 1 container mixed scrap metal. The brush pile was burned, compost pile turned. The propane vendor collected 60 tanks of various sizes.

Operations: 6/12 - A oil tank installation inspection was performed at a Lee's Mills residence and a Supra box was installed at a Buxton Road residence.

6/13 A walk through of the Storage occupancy on Redding Lane was conducted by the Day crew, the occupancy was inspected for fire detection systems and emergency/exit lighting. Annual life safety inspections were conducted at a summer youth camp on Sibley Road. Members of the full-time and call firefighting staff attended a presentation on electric vehicles & firefighters. The training was held at the Sandwich Fire Department, who hosted firefighter Dave Cribbe who led the training.

6/14 A follow-up inspection at the Redding Lane storage occupancy was performed.

6/15 EMS continuing education was held. Paramedic's John Burdette and Steve Burrows assessed patient assessment skills.

6/16 Lt. Frangelli and Chief Bengtson met with the Town Administrator, Town Planner, and the Code Enforcement Officer to discuss how the fire department could be used to aid in certain types of inspections required by the Town. The group will continue to meet to develop a work plan. The Fire Chief will be consulting with the State Fire Marshal's Office for guidance. A place of assembly inspection was conducted at 1094 Whittier Highway.

During Motorcycle Week, the fire department responded to several accidents involving motorcycles. Air medical helicopter services were required for patient care, the helicopter met the patients at Laconia Hospital for transport the appropriate facilities.

Burning Permits: Recent rain and the increasing leaf cover has fire danger level at “Low.” Fire permits are required for open burning, including campfires, and burning brush. Fire Permits may be obtained at the Public Safety Building located at 1035 Whittier Highway or online at www.NHFirePermit.com Or at <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>
