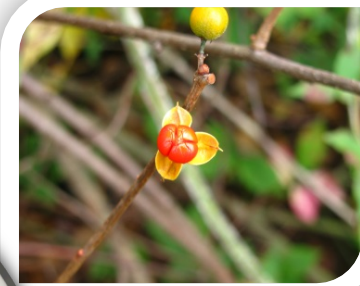

Chances are you drive by them every day, and maybe you even wrestle with them in your own back yard. Non-native, invasive plant species such as Oriental Bittersweet, Japanese Knotweed, and Glossy Buckthorn have become well established in our landscape. There are ways to control these species and even eradicate them from your property.
